

Balaich clàraichte aig Seanadh Earraghaidheal / 1659 / Inrolled boys, the Synod of Argyll

Seo liosta, anns a' cholbh cli, de bhalaich a bha a' togail taic airgid o Sheanadh Earraghaidheal, meadhan an Dàmhair 1659. Bha cuid dhiubh sin a' ceumnachadh agus cuid eile anns na sgoiltean ionadail. Bha Gàidhlig, is cinnteach, aig na h-uile. Chaidh 16 à 18 gu Oilthigh Ghlaschu. Tha an fhianais a chaidh an lorg mu dheidhinn na daoine seo (anns a' cholbh dheis) air fhàgail am Beurla mar a chaidh coinneachadh ris.

The list on the left hand side is taken from a list made by the Synod of Argyll made on the second Wednesday of October, 1659 of all the boys they supported at the Synod of Argyll at schools and University. An effort was made to gather information about them from other sources in the column on the right hand side.

Mr Neel Gillies, student of theology, 100 lib. (Mgr Niall Giolas)	'Laureati anno 1657', MA Glasgow, 1658 . Invited to be minister, Islay, 1659. chaplain to the 9 th Earl of Argyll, minister at Cardross, 1679, to Glasgow Tron 1690, died, 1701. His death left Glasgow without a Gaelic speaking minister, a need which was keenly felt. <i>FES</i> , iii, 474, <i>MAUG</i> , iii, 32. MacTavish, ed., <i>Minutes of the Synod of Argyll</i> , ii, 193. Mr Ard. Beith, 100 lib. (Mgr Gilleasbuig Beith)	Archibald 'Keithius' 'Laureati' at the University of Glasgow , anno 1657. Licenced, presbytery of Dunoon, 1661. Minister of Kilbride, Arran, 1671. <i>MAUG</i> , iii, 32, <i>FES</i> , iv, 56.
Mr Dod. Moreson, 100 merks (Mgr Dòmhnall MacGilleMhoire)	Laureati anno 1655, MA, Glasgow, 1656 . Attending (further?) classes, 1659. Called to parish of Strachur, 1661, Ardnamurchan, 1669. <i>FES</i> , iv, 44, 106. <i>MAUG</i> , iii, 31, 238.
Mr Ard. McLachlan 200 merks (Mgr Gilleasguin MacLachlain)	An Archibald MacLachlan graduated, MA, Glasgow, 1659 . Possibly the same man (?), had trials as a minister, Inveraray, 1655, admitted to charge of Arrochar, 1658. <i>FES</i> , iii, 325. <i>MAUG</i> , iii, 33.
Alexr Campbell, son to Cruachan, 200 marks (Mgr Alasdair Caimbeul)	MA, 1657, Glasgow . Minister of Kilmore & Kilbride, 1666-, translating the psalms into Gaelic, 1678. <i>FES</i> , iv, 94.
For Ard. Henrie at the College, 200 marks (Mgr Uilleam Hendrie)	A William Hendrie is on record at the University of Glasgow, 1663 . Possibly the contraction for Archibald, 'Ard' has been mistaken for the contraction for William, 'Wm.' <i>MAUG</i> , iii, 35.

<p>Ard MacIvvernock at the College, 200 marks Mgr Gilleasbuig Greumach (Mac'IlleMhearnach ?)</p>	<p>MA, Glasgow, 1663. Archibald Graham, alias McIvvernoch, admitted to the parish of Rothesay, 1667, appointed Bishop of the Isles, 1680, died 1702. <i>FES</i>, iv, 40. <i>FES</i>, vii, 350. <i>MAUG</i>, iii, 239.</p>
<p>For Ard Lamount at the college, £80 (Gilleasbuig MacLaomuinn)</p>	<p>Not traced.</p>
<p>For Jon Stewart, son to Kinchunlick, 100 marks (Iain Stiùbhairt)</p>	<p>A John Stewart graduated from the University of Glasgow, 1669. <i>MAUG</i>, iii, 37.</p>
<p>Duncan McArthur (Mgr Donnchadh MacArtair)</p>	<p>Duncan MacArthur is on record at the University of Glasgow in 1662. <i>MAUG</i>, iii, 34.</p>
<p>Dugald Campbell, 200 merks (Dùghall Chaimbeul)</p>	<p>Not traced.</p>
<p>For Ard Campbell son to Dugald Campbell, 200 merks (Mgr Gilleasbuig Chaimbeul)</p>	<p>MA Glasgow, 13th July 1671. Minister in Glassary, 1687. <i>FES</i>, iv, 6.</p>
<p>For Alexr Cameron, 200 merks (Mgr Alasdair Camshron)</p>	<p>MA, Glasgow, 1663. Licenced, 1670, by Dunoon Presbytery and became minister in Kilbride in Arran, 1688. Went to Ireland, 1690. <i>FES</i>, iv, 56.</p>
<p>John Campbell, son to Dod Campbell in Arichammis, 100 marks (Mgr Iain Chaimbeul)</p>	<p>'Laureati,' University of Glasgow, 1661. Mr John Campbell was minister at Kilmun, 1670-1690. <i>FES</i>, iv, 33. <i>MAUG</i>, iii, 34.</p>
<p>For Dunc Campbell, son to Coline Campbell in the parish of Dunoon, 100 marks (Mgr Donnchadh Chaimbeul)</p>	<p>This is possibly the same individual who received an MA from Glasgow, 1655, licenced by Dunoon Presbytery, 1659, became minister at Kilmun, 1661, Campbelltown, 1672, Inverkip, 1688, Dunoon, 1690. <i>FES</i>, iii, 210. <i>FES</i>, iv, 23, 33, 49.</p>
<p>For Dunc. McOlbriide, £40. (Mgr Donnchadh MacGilleBhrìde)</p>	<p>A 'Duncanus MacBridus,' very probably the same man, is on record at the University of Glasgow, 1661. <i>MAUG</i>, iii, 34.</p>
<p>For James Campbell, son to Glenfalloch, £100 (Mgr Seumas Chaimbeul)</p>	<p>James Campbell is on record at the University of Glasgow, 1665. Possibly the same man was minister of Strachur in 1686. <i>MAUG</i>, iii, 35. <i>FES</i>, iv, 44.</p>
<p>For John McLachlan, son to Mr John MacLachlan, 100 marks. (Mgr Iain MacLachlain)</p>	<p>John MacLachlan is on record at the University of Glasgow, 1664. Mr John (the son of Mr John MacLachlan, minister of Kilniver) became minister of Craignish, admitted 1668 and died, c. 1730. <i>MAUG</i>, iii, 35. <i>FES</i>, iv, 2.</p>
